The Small Grants Programme is intended to be responsive to charities' short- and medium-term needs. Grants of up to £50,000 per year are made for one to three years.

The Large Grants Programme allows the Trust to partner with a small number of promising organisations and provide these with grants of up to £250,000 per year for one to three years. **Criteria for support**

- The Trust prefers to concentrate its support on smaller charities where it can work in partnership and its donations can make a real difference.
- The Trust funds charities' core costs, including salaries and overheads, and project costs.

**THE ESTATE OF THE LATE FRED WOLFFING**

Fred Wolffing was a refugee whose family came to live in England to escape Nazi persecution. He lived towards the end of his life in the Barnet area. He died in 2006. Unfortunately he had no family and when he dies he left his estate to be distributed to charity.

Applications to the fund can be between £1,000-10,000 and will be 'one-off' grants. As of mid-March, London Borough of Bexley is now advertising contract opportunities through the new London Tenders Portal, which can be accessed at <http://www.londontenders.org>. In future, this will be the preferred method of advertising and managing the council's contracting opportunities. All current and potential suppliers interested in doing business with the Council are encouraged to take time to register for this service. The system that has been chosen is called ProContract (accessible through the London Tenders portal) and is an internet based application; you therefore only need a PC or laptop and access to the internet to participate. It will enable an entire tender to be securely carried out electronically using the internet. How to register on the London Tenders Portal: When you log onto the site (1) Click on "Supplier's Area"; (2) Click "Register for free". Once you have registered your company's details, you will be led through a number of steps. When complete, your registration will be placed in a queue and dealt with in due course. After your registration has been approved, you will be automatically informed of suitable contract opportunities in the areas you selected in the registration process, including the London Borough of Bexley, and for any of the following boroughs you may have chosen: City of London Corporation, and London boroughs of Bromley, Croydon, Hammersmith and Fulham, Hillingdon, Islington, Redbridge, and Tower Hamlets and Sutton. The Portal will also be used to allow companies to pre-register their company details (accounts, annual reports, certificates of insurance, H&S etc.) which will enable LB of Bexley to pre-qualify suppliers for some contracts, speed up the procurement process and prevent companies having to register their details every time when applying for a contract opportunity.

**Match-funding for advice services - Hillingdon**

New and innovative ways of funding have begun to emerge as the grip of recession tightens. One of these is match-funding. Recently moving in this direction, to increase services available, is Hillingdon Borough's match-funding programme.

**Structure:** Initiated within the Council, £75,000 of funding has been committed through the Cabinet and the programme is being led by the Council and managed in the Partnerships Business and Community Engagement Team. The funding has been made available within existing budgets and the Council has used it to encourage additional funders from within the borough to come forward with matched funding. Matched funding of £75,000 has now been made available by the Hillingdon Community Trust, which supports projects in the southern part of the borough. The Local Strategic Partnership is overseeing the response to the economic downturn and seeking to coordinate activities across partners.

**Aims:** In the short term the Council aims to ensure a wide range of advice and support is available and to determine if there are new ways of providing advice. The funding is being used to provide more telephone

advice through CAB, services to address relationship breakdown and domestic violence, outreach work on financial advice and support, work with community groups on estates to provide targeted financial advice, and additional help for the Hillingdon Credit Union. The Council's preference is to have a broad package of advice and support measures. In addition, having a continued relationship with some of the groups has enabled additional sums to be invested and allows other issues to be discussed.

**Next steps:** £150,000 from Hillingdon Council has been allocated over two years (2009-10 and 2010-11). Given that the length of the recession is unpredictable, and the impacts on the need for advice and support are only beginning to be understood, the Council's main focus in the immediate future is to work out if the funding stream is sustainable and targeting the right needs. As it is too early to predict outcomes, as well as need, the Council is concerned with ensuring that the funding is not a temporary uplift for organisations already depending on the Council for funding.

**Checks and balances:** The biggest challenge on the horizon for Hillingdon is the restricted budget available to allocate to new priorities for the recession, as central government reductions have an impact on local government. It considers now as timely to have a dialogue to determine priorities. For future success of match-funding, Hillingdon is clear that the right monitoring systems need to be in place. Monitoring will be key to track how the funds are spent and what they are achieving.
